New HCRCC Field!

On Sunday, June 28th, we held a special meeting at the HCRCC clubhouse for an announcement on the future of the club.

To summarize the meeting, Bob Richardt and Duncan Campbell announced to those in attendance the **PURCHASE** of a 1/4 section of land for the club to **OWN** and to serve as the future home of the HCRCC. This was made possible by a generous donation by Bob. The donation includes buildings to be constructed on the site including construction of a club house with services, a tractor shed (with new tractor!), a landing strip, sundshade structure, and several other facilities. It will truly be a turn-key site for the HCRCC, hopefully ready by spring of 2016. It is located about 13km from the city limits just off of highway 5 east towards Humbolt near the Sunset Estates.

Bob intends on retiring and will soon be selling the land our current field is on. He forecasts the sale will occur in the next two or three years. Regardless it should be a smooth transition to our new field.

This has to be one of the biggest if not **THE** biggest event of our 30 year history. We are truly blessed!

A truly big **THANK YOU** to Bob, and to the group of three who helped Bob with the new field selection and purchase: Duncan Campbell, Art Cey, and Ron Prokopchuk.

Flying Dave Gillespie's Tiger Moth

Guys, I know I am not the first of our club to fly this beautiful plane, but I am sure glad I could join those select fellows. As many of you may have noticed or seen, a Tiger Moth often flies low and close to our field on quiet evenings. The pilot is often Mr. Dave Gillespie, who owns a strip a few kilometers south of our field. He is a very nice gentleman that loves aviation. He has flown many planes, including Harvards, Sopwith Camel, Albatros, Ultimate, Christian Eagle, Pitts Bipe and a Supermarine Spitfire.

One day I was doing my thing while attending the sod turning ceremony of the upcoming Saskatchewan Aviation Museum and Learning Centre when I had the pleasure to be introduced to Dave. I knew it was a matter of time to eventually bump into him as he knows various members and the HCRCC, but also is involved, and owns his own glider.

We started chatting about gliders and WWI airplanes which culminated with an invitation to fly my VK Nieuport 17 at this strip that same evening. The thing is, Dave also has much love for WWI era airplanes, having 2 full size replicas himself that he owns and flies as often as possible.

I tried to fly her as scale as possible and I think Dave really enjoyed it, because as soon as I landed my model, he called me over to his hangar to help him get his Tiger Moth ready for a flight!!!!

He knew I was a glider pilot, but he had only heard it from third parties, so I tried to keep my composure to restrain myself from doing, asking or saying something really stupid as I felt like I was a kid again that was taking a VERY cool bicycle around the block (that times 100)!



I got into the plane with the biggest smile you have ever seen and strapped myself in. When Dave started taxing the plane to the runway, it was pure aviation nostalgia!

Few minutes into the flight, he gave me the controls and I loved every single second of it.

I didn't want to give the controls back, but when it was time to land, I put her into the circuit and Dave just babied her right in, he then told me that he hoped I had enjoyed it, as the Tiger Moth is just like flying a real WWI plane.

Guys! I honestly didn't lose my flying-smile until the end of that week!! And that flight with Dave has to be on the top, somewhere next to my very best experiences in life.
